


# Tuning Guide



- Put the tuner on the headstock. (See pictures below.)
- Look at the picture of the instrument you are holding to figure out the name of the string you are tuning.
- The string is in tune when the green section lights up.
- If the red section lights up, the string is "flat."
  Turn the peg clockwise (away from you).
- If the yellow section lights up, the string is "sharp."
  Turn the peg counterclockwise (towards you).










Gibson RB-2 banjo owned by Ralph Stanley






# Lap Steel Guitar











Bill Monroe's Gibson F-5 mandolin
